VI. Update on Impact Factor

- a. The **Journal Impact Factor** (**JIF**) is a measure reflecting the average number of citations to articles published in journals, books, patent document, thesis, project reports, news papers, conference/seminar proceedings, documents published in internet, notes and any other approved documents. It is measure the relative importance of a journal within its field, with journals of higher journal impact factors deemed to be more important than those with lower ones.
- b. **How the Impact Factor was Calculated:** The calculation is based on a two-year period and involves dividing the number of times articles were cited by the number of articles that are citable.
- c. Sample Calculation of 2020 IF of a journal:
 - 1.A = the number of times articles published in 2018 and 2019 were cited by indexed journals during 2018.
 - 2.B =the total number of "citable items" published in 2018 and 2019.
 - 3.A/B = 2020 impact factor
